Structure, Governance and Management

The Parochial Church Council is a corporate body established by the Church of England. The PCC operates under the Parochial Church Council Powers Measure.

Objectives and Activities

St John's PCC has the responsibility of cooperating with the rector in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. In addition to the church building and the churchyard, the PCC also has responsibility for the maintenance of two thirds of the graveyard on St Giles Hill.

Achievements and Performance

Church Attendance

The church has 52 parishioners on the Electoral Roll, 26 of whom live in the parish. Average attendance for a typical Sunday Parish Eucharist, the major service of the week, is about 40, this number rising significantly at the principal festivals.

Review of the Year

PCC Report

During the year the PCC has discussed:

- Facilities for children in the church and a proposed glassed-in area for them under the tower for use during services
- A service for those who have been baptised in the church in the last 6 years
- Deanery Mission Action Plan
- The parish share
- Future mission partnership
- Parish Action plan together with All Saints.
- Diocesan Lent Course

The PCC minutes should be displayed in the church for those who do not have access to a computer.

Rector's Report

2014 has been a busy year within both the benefice and deanery. The deanery completed a Deanery Mission Action Plan giving the direction of travel for the Benefice Mission Action Plans, which are being developed through 2015. The biggest single bearing upon East Winchester will be the proposed reduction in deanery stipendiary clergy from 11.5 posts to 7. This means that we will cluster together with other city centre parishes, developing new and existing forms of ministry, and pooling resources so that we can more fully *Live the Mission of Jesus*. The church of the future will be resourced by local vocations, which is both exciting and challenging.

We are blessed ministerially with Rev'd Margaret Scrivener as our Curate, the retired priest Rev'd Richard Burningham bringing experience and commitment to St. John's and our Licensed Lay Minister Sabine Burningham. At the end of 2014 it was also announced that Christine Smith will remain in East Winchester for her curacy. We have strong ministerial resources which can help

us grow as disciples and share our faith with others.

St. John's continues to explore ways of reaching out to the Winnall estate and particularly young people. We are involved in a Bible Club and other activities at the school; in the Youth Club; and our own family and children's activities, both during and beyond our Sunday morning Eucharist. We are also looking at how links with the new *Living Waters Church*, at the Community Centre, can be developed. The ancient building of St. John's has also been used for music, poetry and dancing.

We continue to draw together across the benefice with a shared Lent Course, a procession between the parish churches on Palm Sunday and joint worship in August. East Winchester has three churches with much in common but also much that is distinctive.

On a personal level, East Winchester is a great place to minister and I am grateful to the worshipping community. I remain every thankful for the support and reflection of the Churchwardens David and Grahame, the PCC and ministers.

Churchwardens' Report

St John's continues to offer an oasis of tranquillity and spirituality in the centre of Winchester, being always open to the public.

Our ministry still benefits from having a rector, curate, reader, and one retired priest. Whilst still a very active member of our congregation, our other retired priest, John Gawne-Cain, has now stepped down from taking services. We give thanks for John's ministry over a number of years.

Planned Giving Report

The Planned Giving Scheme is remaining constant with the member numbers staying at 27. The 27 members give on a regulare basis, with by the weekly green envelopes, or by standing order, or both.

The repayment claim from the tax authorities should be in the region of £4300- the exact figure will be available at the end of the current tax year.

Fabric Report

Happily, once again there have been no major issues affecting the fabric of the church, most activities being confined to maintenance requirements. These have covered the lighting and audio system, as well as some work on the

west wall of the church, where some re-pointing is being carried out as a result of the last quinquennial inspection.

Friends of St John

Once again the Friends have had a relatively quiet year. There has been no change on the committee. Three events have been organised and some purchases have been made for the Church.

Last April as a new departure a Wine Tasting was organised. It proved very popular. May saw a return of the Russian choral group, Lyra which again was well supported and much enjoyed. Finally, in December we had the now traditional compline service and Advent Tea. This happened to coincide with a booked concert by an outside organisation who joined in and helped swell the numbers.

Our contributions to the Church included: the purchase of additional furnishings for the children's corner; a new set of candles for the chandelier; an oak stand for the Easter and Advent candles, along with an appropriate supply of special candles; and a second collar microphone for the clergy.

All the events realised a modest profit and our balance at the bank is still capable of providing further funding if needed

Children of St John's

Although the number of children attending remains small, ranging in age from birth to 2-11 years, there is still a demand for a space where youngsters can play within the church. The families who attend are engaged and enthusiastic and after consultation with them the play area has been refurbished and restocked this year with soft fabrics, cushions, carpets and furniture. A speaker has been placed in this area so that the parents who wish to stay with their children can more easily hear and take part in the services. This has encouraged vigorous timpani playing by the children during the hymns. We have provided a variety of age appropriate Christian books to use in the adjacent small vestry for storytelling which has been cleared to give more space for the children. The Welcome bags for children have also been restocked, some youngsters choosing to stay with their families.

Three more adults are being DBS approved which will raise the complement to 8 ensuring that support for parents and attention to children can be given as required. Some families attend the "Small Saints" service held within the Benefice at All Saints on a monthly basis.

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During the year we had five child centred Godly Play sessions on a Sunday afternoon attended by two and then three sisters from the same family. After a review of the work with children input was given to the Sunday Funday events; three have been held monthly and are well supported by the congregation too.

Members of the congregation who have been trained and checked also support the local primary school and the youth club on the Winnall estate.

No safeguarding issues have arisen this year.

Financial Review

Our total income was £34376. Expenditure was £27817, giving a surplus of £6559. We are still keeping £40 000 in the Diocesan Loan fund.

Parish Share has been paid in full but not all during 2014 (£21500). £2380 has been earned through marriages, funerals and other fees.

Owing to an oversight funerals and wedding payments have been difficult to find – some went to All Saints, since recovered – and the diocesan fees of £1274 have not yet been paid.

Clergy expenses amounted to £494 during the year, and we incurred £1361 in running costs. There were some generous wedding and funeral collections amounting to nearly £1000.

The continued use of the church by the Chesil Theatre helps our income, and we also benefited from one other hiring of the church.

St John's stopped paying bank charges and were refunded £1798 plus £200 in "compensation" and a further £9 will appear after a complaint about the time taken to answer the phone!

Grateful thanks to John Gawne-Cain and Catherine Thom for their support without which The treasurer could not function.

Reserves Policy

Our general fund balance on 31/12/2014 was £6,559.67 .

It is our policy to invest any funds surplus with the Diocesan Loan Fund.
